

Who is this for?

We are searching for people with a good horse handling, willing to work with them (grooming, basic vet care, management of horses and electric fences in the paddocks, schooling and training...) and to help in daily outdoor activities in the farm, taking care of the tack, general field maintenance (pruning, cleaning trails, painting, among others).

The activities are usually very varied (we do not have a fixed daily routine), also depending on the time of year, so flexibility is required. We like to get the best from volunteers, according to their skills and aptitudes. It is very important to have a good attitude and pro-activity and be open to learning new things. We value people who also have knowledge and skills in photography, videos and editing, marketing, cooking, ecotourism, bioconstruction and gardening.







We offer

Accommodation and meals

You will stay in La Casita, our shared space. It is a small rustic cabin, but with everything you need, with beds and sheets and a mosquito net, a bathroom with hot shower, an equipped kitchen and a living room. It's not unusual to hear the horses grazing close to the cabin during the night! We offer lunch, which we share in our house, leaving breakfast and dinner at volunteer's expense.







Learning with horses

You will have the opportunity to observe and learn about horse's natural behavior in the herd, in an ethological and natural management. You will have the chance to delve deeply into a natural horse handling (Mauro is a vet, so it allows us to consider horse's health in a more holistic way). You will be able to learn about their ethology in daily work with them and access our rich library of horse books. Depending on your abilities, you can practice in the different stages of training, join our rides as an assistant-guide and learn about barefoot care, balance, and maintenance.

Requirements

- Minimum age of 18 years
- Conversional Spanish and/or English and/or Italian
- Can stay 1 month or longer
- Horse experience (e.g. catch horses in the paddock, leading the horse, cleaning horse's hoof, saddling, riding bareback, mounting from the ground, riding safely and independently outside)
- We ask for 4-5 hours a day (although when we deal with horses, training, care, riding... it may be more) for 6 days a week
